



MAMMOTH TRANSPORTATION GUIDE

To ensure a smooth experience at your clinic, here's a comprehensive guide to transportation and parking at Mammoth, helping you navigate the area effectively.

GENERAL INFORMATION

All participants must arrange transportation to Mammoth for their clinic check-in. Once there, you'll find several parking options available at or near the Village Plaza and throughout the Mammoth area. It's recommended to familiarize yourself with these parking options ahead of your clinic day.

For in-bounds clinics: We recommend parking in the Village (e.g., Berner Street paid lot or nearby), meeting your group and then using the Village Gondola to access the hill. Alternatively, if you're staying in Mammoth the night before, consider taking the bus to the Village Plaza for check-in to avoid parking challenges altogether.

For backcountry clinics: A vehicle will be necessary for transportation to Mammoth and possibly for traveling up to 30 miles outside of town for your clinic. We suggest parking in one of the options listed below for check-in. From there, you can coordinate with your group and consider carpooling to your destination.

CLINIC CHECK-IN PARKING

Options Near the Village Plaza

[1] FREE LIMITED PARKING

Public Parking Lot: Adjacent to the Westin Hotel (a short walk to the Village Plaza), there is a free public parking lot. However, this lot has only 20 spots available and a maximum parking duration of 2 hours. This lot is ideal for quick check-in purposes, but not recommended for all-day parking.

[2] PAID PARKING OPTIONS

Berner Street Parking Lot: Across the street from the Village Plaza, this lot offers various pricing options. Rates may fluctuate during peak holidays and events, but generally follow these guidelines:

- \$20.00 for overnight until 8:00am
- \$35.00 for 24 hours
- \$65.00 for 48 hours
- \$90.00 for 90 hours

Street Parking: Timed parking spots are available across the street from The Westin Monache Resort on Canyon Boulevard and on both sides of Minaret Road, but they are *very limited*. **Note:**

- 30-minute parking spaces are located on the side of the street next to the Village Plaza.
- No overnight parking is permitted from 10:00pm to 6:00am on these streets.

PUBLIC TRANSIT IN MAMMOTH

Transit Options Overview

Mammoth offers a free daytime and evening transit service that is highly recommended for visitors staying within the town who are attending in-bounds clinics. Public transit is convenient and cost-effective, but you will need your own vehicle or alternative arrangements for backcountry clinic transportation.

ONSITE CARPOOLING GROUPS

To minimize our parking impact in the backcountry areas, your guide will encourage your group to carpool to your designated trailhead. This approach not only helps reduce the carbon footprint but also ensures a smoother and more cohesive travel experience for participants.

CLINIC SHUTTLE

To help reduce congestion at popular trailheads and assist guests without suitable vehicles, a limited-capacity shuttle will be available to transport participants to and from select trailheads.
